PROGRAM CANCELLATION POLICY

- Program refund policy: If you need to cancel out of a program, notify us 10 days before the first day of the program for a full refund. Household credit will be given if you cancel less than 10 days before the first day of the program.

Sports and Fitness Programs

T-BALL LEAGUE

MUST BE 3 YEARS OLD BY MAY 2, 2026 TO REGISTER

Learn fundamental T-ball skills in a fun, noncompetitive environment. Volunteer coaches will teach throwing, catching, hitting a ball off a tee and running the bases. Teams will be divided by elementary school. *We will do our best, but cannot guarantee special requests for team placement.*

Register by April 3, 2026 to be placed on a team in your school or school zone.

Three leagues available: Ages 3-4 (Little Legends), ages 4-5 (Rising Rookies), ages 6-7 (Junior Sluggers)

This league is designed to be a low-commitment introduction to sports. Teams will meet one night per week during the first five weeks, transitioning to two nights per week during the final two weeks of the season. Schedules vary by age group.

The 7-year old division is designed as a T-Ball / Coach-Pitch hybrid, allowing players to begin transitioning toward more structured game play while keeping the focus on participation and confidence. Specific rules and expectations will be shared with families prior to the season.

Fee: \$65 City of Bozeman residents; \$85 nonresidents

Practices and Games: All practices and games are scheduled by Bozeman Parks and Recreation to ensure consistent experience for all teams.

- Practices begin April 21
- Games run May 4-June 5
- Games are held at Beall Park, 415 N. Bozeman Ave., and Story Mill Park, 600 Bridger Dr.
- Practice and game structures vary by age group to match attention span, energy level and skill readiness.

WE DEPEND 100% ON VOLUNTEER COACHES to make this league happen, and we need one or two volunteers per team. Background checks are required and will be run through the City of Bozeman Human Resources Department. We will hold a mandatory preseason coach's meeting on **April 14 at 5:30 p.m. at Story Mill Community Center**. Coaching is limited to a one- or two-night a week commitment for seven weeks and includes one practice and/or game a week.

AMERICAN RED CROSS LIFEGUARD CLASSES

The purpose of the American Red Cross Lifeguarding course is to provide entry-level lifeguard participants with the knowledge and skills to prevent, recognize and respond to aquatic emergencies, and to provide care for breathing and cardiac emergencies, injuries and sudden illness until emergency medical services (EMS) personnel take over.

Lessons are Monday-Thursday

Parent-Tot/Angelfish: Youth ages 6 months through 3 years and a parent or two. Have fun learning how to prepare your child for a lifetime of swimming. Parents will be in the water with their child playing fun games and learning proper holding techniques. A MT Health Code-approved swim diaper is required.

Preschool/Clownfish: For children ages 3 to 4 who can be in a class without needing their parent in the water.

Youth Lessons Levels 1-6: Classes are divided based on ability. Participants may be moved by instructors based on ability. Swimmers must be able to complete all certification requirements to move to the next level.

Level 1: Marlins — Ages 5 & Up

Appropriate for children who may not yet be comfortable putting their faces in the water, are unable to float without support and have not been introduced to strokes.

Level 2: Dolphins — Ages 5 and Up

Appropriate for children who are able to put their faces in the water and hold their breath for at least 3 seconds, float on front and back unassisted and have developed basic arm and leg motor action.

Level 3: Whales — Ages 6 and Up

At this level swimmers have been introduced to basic strokes but are still developing strength and combined arm and leg actions.

Level 4: Hammerhead Sharks — Ages 6 and Up

Swimmers are able to tread water for one minute, enter deep water and return to side, swim 25-yards of front crawl and elementary backstroke.

Level 5: Tiger Sharks — Ages 7 and Up

Swimmers are able to swim front crawl and elementary backstroke for 25-yards and swim breaststroke, back crawl, butterfly and sidestroke for 15-yards.

Level 6: Orcas — Ages 11-14 Lifeguard Preparation and Swim Workout

This program is geared toward improving endurance and technique with all strokes. Swimmers will also be introduced to basic lifeguarding skills and equipment.

SWIM LESSON WEATHER POLICY

Lessons will be held at Bogert Pool if at all possible. Weather temperatures below 50 degrees or a lightning storm will cause the lessons to be cancelled. If lessons are cancelled, a free day-pass will be issued for that missed class. 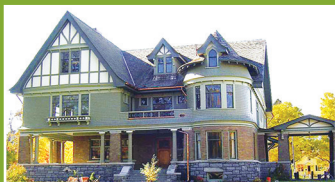
